AN ACT to suppress intemperance, pauperism and crime.

Passed May 29, 1873: three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Every husband, wife, child, parent, guardian, employer or other person, who shall be injured in person, or property, or means of support, by any intoxicated person, or in consequence of the intoxication, habitual or otherwise, of any person, shall have a right of action in his or her name, against any person or persons who shall, by selling or giving away intoxicating liquors, caused the intoxication, in whole or in part, of such person or persons, and any person or persons owning or renting or permitting the occupation of any building or premises and having knowledge that intoxicating liquors are to be sold therein shall be liable, severally or jointly with the person or persons selling or giving intoxicating liquors aforesaid, for all damages sustained and for exemplary damages; and all damages recovered by a tutor under this act shall be paid either to such tutor or to his or her parent, guardian or next friend as the court shall direct; and the unlawful sale or giving away of intoxicating liquors shall work a forfeiture of all rights of the lessee or tenant under any lease or contract of rent upon the premises.

§ 2. In any action arising for violations of the provisions of this act any justice of the peace in the county where the offense is committed, shall have jurisdiction to try and determine the same, providing the amount of damages claimed do not exceed two hundred dollars in which case and where the damages claimed do not exceed five hundred dollars, the justice of the peace before whom the action is commenced shall cooperate with himself any other two justices of the peace in the same county, who shall have jurisdiction to try and determine the same.

§ 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
