Section 28. That any person who wilfully and for profit shall infringe any copyright secured by this act, or who shall knowingly or wilfully aid or abet such infringement, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment for not exceeding one year or by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, nor more than one thousand dollars, or both, in the discretion of the court.

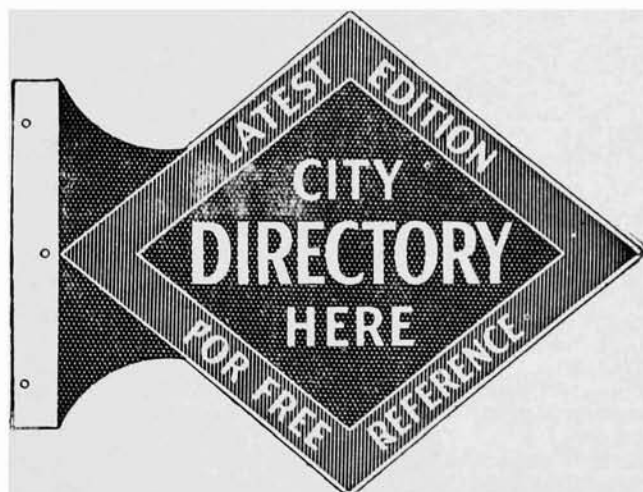

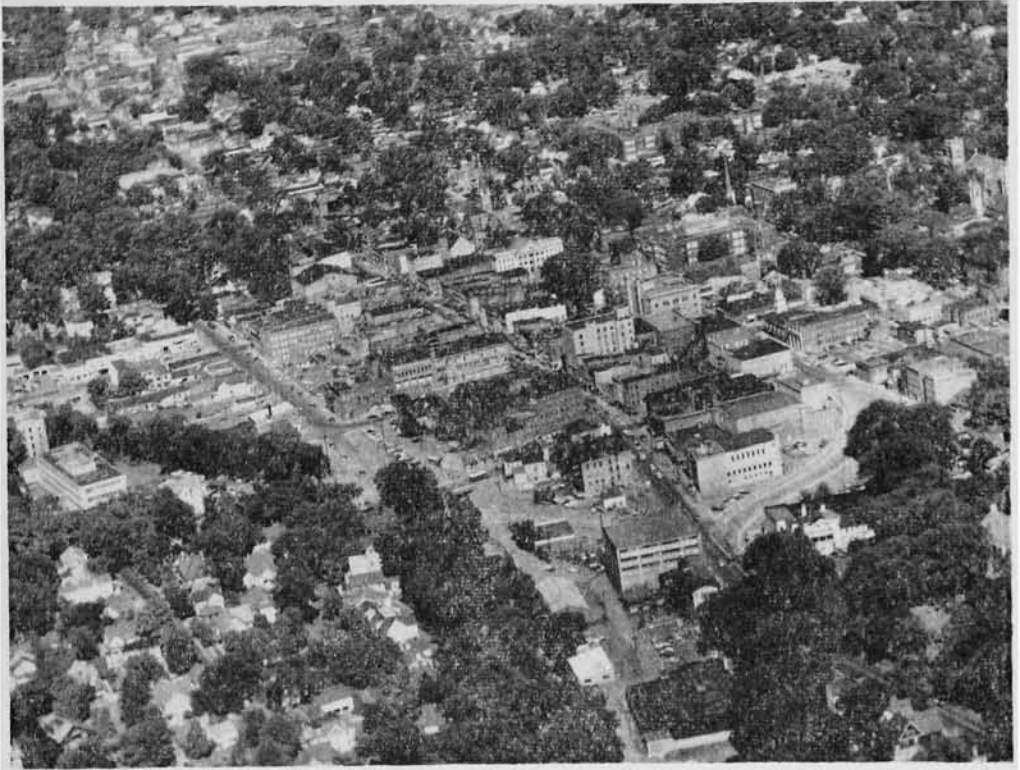

The publishers of this Directory consider it advisable and desirable to set forth the following paragraphs, in as simple and attractive a manner as possible, to enable the readers of these descriptive pages to comprehend as many of the outstanding features of Ithaca as limited space permits. The local resident, the visitor, and the distant reader about Ithaca wish to gain an impression of Ithaca as well as to have at hand a statistical reference regarding the city and its people. It is the publishers' aim to portray as much of Ithaca's charm and greatness as is consistent with facts. The teachings of the City Map and the City Directory about localities, districts, street locations, street changes, growth of sections and general city changes are of great importance to property owners, old residents, new residents and school children. Racial characteristics of names in the Directory enable the consultant to gain a very comprehensive knowledge of the inhabitants of the city and many other educational facts. Notable men all through history have contributed their philosophy as to the value of knowledge about the home town. Here is one from Abraham Lincoln: "I like to see a man proud of the place in which he lives. I like to see a man live so that his place will be proud of him." In studying the following, remember that the Ithaca City Directory disseminates this information far and wide where this Directory represents Ithaca in the Free Directory Library Exchange System of North America. The Ithaca City Directory, with over 500 closely printed pages, is the City of Ithaca in book form; its family and social life, business and industrial life is portrayed in great detail. The publishers invite and accept constructive criticism and suggestions for the improvement of the Directory for the benefit of Ithaca and all interested.

LOCATION—The City of Ithaca, located in the heart of the Finger Lakes Region of Central New York State at the head of beautiful Cayuga Lake, is famous for four things:

1. Its educational institutions
2. Its position as the agricultural center of the northeast United States
3. Its rugged and picturesque scenic beauty, and
4. Its many progressive small industries.

Known far and wide as the home of Cornell University and Ithaca College, Ithaca is noted for its culture and refined atmosphere in all activities of business and social life.

Its latitude is 42° 27' north and its longitude is 76° 29' west. Located in the center of the Southern Tier of New York State, it is 240 miles south to New York City; Boston is 400 miles east, Albany 175 miles east, Buffalo is 150 miles west, Elmira 35 miles south, Binghamton 50 miles southeast, Syracuse 55 miles northeast and Rochester 88 miles northwest.

TOPOGRAPHY—Ithaca is in a land of lakes and hills, deep ravines and towering cliffs, waterfalls and cataracts. The city itself is bordered on three sides by hills cut through by the deep gorges of Six Mile, Cascadilla and Fall Creeks which abound with cascades and waterfalls, and on the fourth side by Cayuga Lake, all providing a most picturesque setting. Climate ranges in temperature from an average minimum of 26° to an average maximum of 69°. This comparatively close range of minimum and maximum temperatures results from Ithaca's enviable position at the head of 40-mile long Cayuga Lake. The elevation of the lake, the lowest point in the city is 383 feet above sea level and Cornell University Campus, the highest part of the city, is approximately 800 feet above sea level.

HISTORICAL—Ithaca was settled in 1789, ten years after the visit of a detachment of 200 men commanded by Col. Dearborn¹ from the expeditionary force of General Sullivan first visited the area on September 23, 1779. It was named Ithaca by Simeon DeWitt, Surveyor General under Washington in 1795 after the ancient Greek capitol of Ithaca. It was incorporated as a village in 1821, chartered as a city in 1888 and has been the county seat of Tompkins County since the county's formation in 1818. In days long gone past, Ithaca was a center of inland water transportation as well as the salt center of New York State. Ithaca celebrated in 1939 its 150th Anniversary.

MERCANTILE—Ithaca is a trading center of some 80,000 persons and has stores comparable with those of cities much larger. Because of the University population and a community educated to want the best, retail stores carry merchandise equal in variety and quality to stores in leading eastern cities. There are over 450 retail stores, employing over 2,500 persons with annual sales in excess of \$60,000,000. There are also over 46 wholesale houses employing over 400 with annual sales of \$20,000,000. About 183 service trade establishments, doing an annual business of \$6,000,000 and employing over 800 persons are also located in Ithaca. There are 287 professional offices located within the city limits.

INDUSTRIAL—Although Ithaca is not primarily an industrial city, it has 48 manufacturing establishments with an employment figure in excess of 4,200; a payroll totaling over \$17,500,000 and a total value added by manufacture of \$15,967,000. Cornell University

POPULATION—Ithaca's metropolitan area is presently estimated to have a population of 40,000. This includes the City of Ithaca, Village of Cayuga Heights, Ithaca Township and the students at Cornell University and Ithaca College. As in many communities, extensive growth has been seen in the population outside the central city. Between 1900 and 1950 the city population increased from 13,150 to 19,800 or 65%. The town and village during the same period increased from 1,600 to 8,600 or 540%. The student population in 1900 was slightly less than 3,000, today there are nearly 11,500.

Ithaca's population is about 87% native born white, about 3% colored and 10% foreign born.

Ithaca in 1950 had 7,188 homes with 45.3% owner occupied.

Tompkins County in 1950 had 59,122 inhabitants, today its population is estimated to be over 70,000. Both figures include students.

employs 5,800 and Ithaca College 175, while G. L. F. (Grange League Federation) has 500 employees and the New York State Electric & Gas Corporation 447.

Among the principal products manufactured here are; adding machines, shotguns, power drive chains, leather goods, rayon and cotton underwear, lantern slides, technical mirrors, precision machine tools, scientific instruments, pottery, salt, photo engraving, books, magazines detergents, woodworking and dairy products.

Ithaca has an unusually intelligent class of workmen. Educational advantages for industrial workers and their families include a liberal policy provision for vocational education and training in public schools.

Ithaca has been developing also as a research center. The General Electric Company established a "center" in Ithaca several years ago and recently the Westinghouse Electric Company announced they would locate a research installation here.

There are sites available for industrial development and several organizations are active in the promotion of industrial expansion within the Ithaca trading area. Inquiries addressed to the Ithaca Chamber of Commerce will bring a prompt reply.



CORNELL STUDENTS AT WORK

EDUCATIONAL—Ithaca is among the leading educational centers of the state. The Ithaca enlarged City School District includes 15 public schools with an enrollment of 8,800

and a staff of 320 teachers and administrators. The District covers 160 square miles. There is one parochial school in Ithaca providing classes from Kindergarten through eighth grade.



BOYNTON JR. HIGH SCHOOL

Cornell University, which is one of the great universities of North America, located on one of America's most beautiful campuses overlooking the lower parts of the city and Lake Cayuga, was founded in 1865 by Ezra Cornell. The normal enrollment is about 10,000 students. The university includes colleges of Art and Science, Medicine, Law, Engineering, Architecture, the State College of Agriculture, Veterinary Medicine, Industrial and Labor Relations, Home Economics, a Graduate School, a School of Hotel Management, Education, Nursing, Nutrition and Business and Public Administration. It occupies about 7,000 acres of land and 155 buildings, which with their equipment are valued at about \$35,000,000 while endowment add about \$42,000,000 more to the resources of the institutions. There are also located in the city Ithaca College, devoted to music, drama and physical education; the Cascadilla Tutoring School. There are four libraries, as follows; Cornell Public Library is located in the heart of the business district and gives an extensive service to the public; the Cornell University Library located on the campus has over 825,000 volumes including special collections having international fame; the Tompkins County Bar Association Library is located in Ithaca Savings Bank Building; the Free Directory Library maintained by the H. A. Manning Co. of N. Y. in the Chamber of Commerce Rooms at 114 North Aurora St.



ITHACA COLLEGE

FINANCIAL—Ithaca has 3 banks with total deposits of about \$50,000,000 and one savings and loan association. These banks are well housed and progressive and have grown with the city. The per capita wealth is high. Ithaca rated third in New York State in 1950. The net taxable value of city property was \$77,167,756 in 1957. The real value of city property

totals \$144,496,080. The city government has operated within its budget for the past 35 years, has a low bonded indebtedness and the highest financial rating. The tax rate is \$9.90 per \$1,000.

TRANSPORTATION—Ithaca is served by Mohawk Airlines, Inc., which operates from the Tompkins County Airport, largest of the city's two airports, providing direct air passenger, mail and cargo service to 23 New York State communities, 6 in Massachusetts, as well as to New Jersey, New Hampshire and Detroit, Michigan. The Ithaca Municipal Airport, only three miles from the heart of the business section, is the second oldest in the state. Ithaca is the hub of a network of highways that make travel in central western New York State a tourist's dream. Ithaca is likewise served by the main line of the Lehigh Valley Railroad. The Ithaca Railway Inc., operates a modern bus service serving the entire city and surrounding suburbs. The city bus terminal on South Aurora St. provides a terminus for interurban buses from Elmira, Watkins Glen, Binghamton, Cortland, Syracuse, Rochester, New York, Auburn, etc.

Ithaca is also the southern terminal of the New York Barge Canal system and is provided with docking facilities for boats operating on the canal. Several hundred pleasure crafts including the larger motor cruisers have Ithaca as their home port. Several large boatyards provide sheltered waters and cover for boats whose valuation approximates a quarter million dollars owned by persons from the surrounding area and cities as far away as Elmira, Binghamton, Owego and Scranton.

Daily trucking service is provided to all business in the area by numerous motor truck freight lines.

PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS AND BOATING—The natural topography of the land here makes the city a natural park. There are three public parks within the city.

which is located at the lake end of the city and has recreation and athletic facilities also an extensive bathing beach on Lake Cayuga. The Cornell Campus is extensive and supplies a very beautiful park-like effect for the upper part of the city. The following scenic beauty spots in and not far from the city are: Buttermilk Falls State Park, Cascadilla Glen, Cayuga Lake, Coys Glen, Robert H. Treman State Park, Fall Creek Gorge, Ithaca Gorge and Falls, Point Lookout, Taughannock Falls State Park, Watkins Glen State Park.

Ithaca and Cayuga Lake have become the headquarters for small boating enthusiasts throughout the Southern Tier of New York State and much of north central Pennsylvania. Each year more and more boats are brought to Cayuga Lake. In 1957, it was estimated that over \$1,000,000 worth of pleasure crafts made Ithaca their "home port." In addition, hundreds of transient boats visit Ithaca each year using both the public and private launching and docking facilities.

SPORTING EVENTS—A wealth of both spectator and participation sporting events may be found in the Ithaca area. There are four golf courses, roller skating, bowling, swimming, tennis, archery, and many other sports facilities are available. The recently completed Lynah Ice Rink at Cornell University is open to the public for skating. Football, ice hockey, crew, baseball, and polo are only a few of the many sporting events taking place in Ithaca on a year-round schedule.



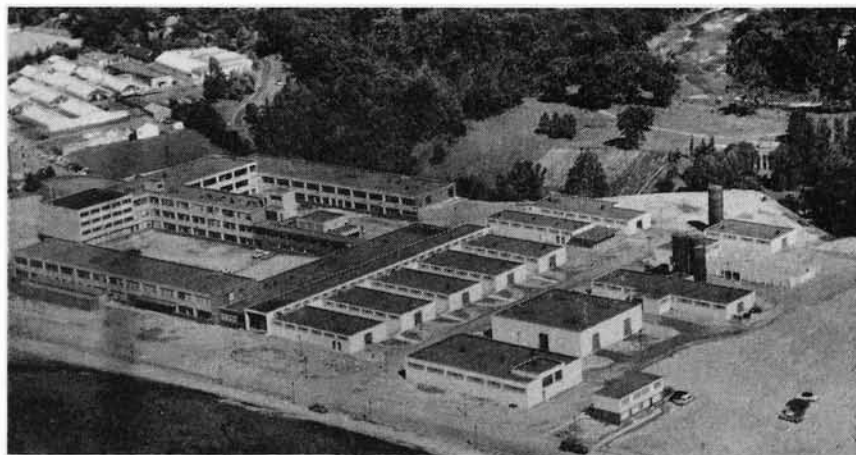

Known as the center of agriculture activity in Northeastern United States, Ithaca is the home of the New York State College of Agriculture, Cooperative Grange League Federation Exchange, Inc., Empire Livestock Marketing Cooperative, New York Artificial Breeders Cooperative, and many other organizations of great importance to rural interests. Cornell University's annual Farm and Home Week each year is a highlight even of our agricultural community.



COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE—CORNELL UNIVERSITY

Ithaca has very active fraternal, club and social life with over 200 organizations listed, there are 6 hospitals with nearly 500 beds. 4 theatres with a capacity of 4,800, five auditoriums with a capacity of 5,200, 21 churches covering nearly every major denomination and 16 hotels and motels, plus many fine tourist homes. Listings of accommodations are available at the Chamber of Commerce.

In 1957, there were 18,586 passenger cars registered and 25,571 electric meters, 10,043 gas meters, and 22,435 telephones in use. The Postal Receipts amounted to \$927,700.00 and airmail poundage amounted to 51,700 pounds. The city's water storage capacity (not connected with Lake Cayuga) is 350,000,000 gal. with a daily pump of over 3,000,000.
