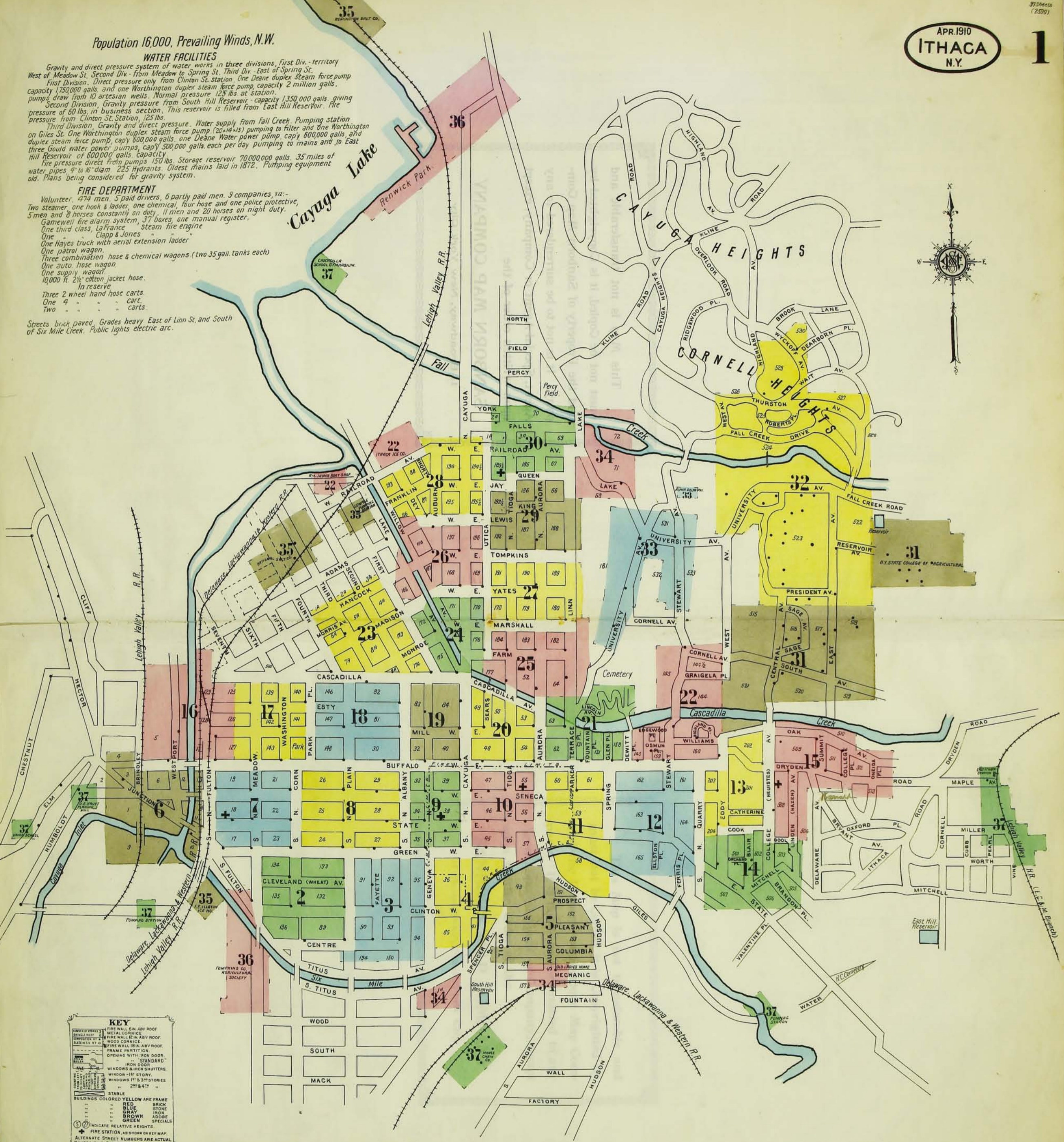

 First Division. Direct pressure only from Clinton St. station. One Deane duplex steam force pump capacity 1,750,000 galls. and one Worthington duplex steam force pump capacity 2 million galls. pumps draw from 10 artesian wells. Normal pressure 125 lbs. at station.  
 Second Division. Gravity pressure from South Hill Reservoir - capacity 1,350,000 galls. giving pressure of 60 lbs. in business section. This reservoir is filled from East Hill Reservoir. Fire pressure from Clinton St. Station, 125 lbs.  
 Third Division. Gravity and direct pressure. Water supply from Fall Creek. Pumping station on Giles St. One Worthington duplex steam force pump (20-14-15) pumping to filter and one Worthington duplex steam force pump, capy 600,000 galls. one Deane Water power pump, capy 600,000 galls. and three Gould water power pumps, capy 500,000 galls. each per day pumping to mains and to East Hill Reservoir of 600,000 galls. capacity.  
 Fire pressure direct from pumps 150 lbs. Storage reservoir 70,000,000 galls. 35 miles of water pipes 4" to 16" diam. 225 hydrants. Oldest mains laid in 1872. Pumping equipment old. Plans being considered for gravity system.
