It will be interesting to compare the above results of enumeration with the official statements of the state canvassers, showing the numbers that actually exercised the privilege of voting, by counties, and for each year since the removal of the property qualification of voters, by an amendment of the Constitution in 1826. In preparing the following table, the votes given for governor on alternate years, those for senators on the intermediate years previous to 1846, and those for Secretary of State since 1846, have been taken. The total votes for all regular candidates, and the scattering votes are included. A diagram illustrating this subject is given opposite page lvii. of this volume.

lxxxiv INTRODUCTION.

Persons over Twenty-one years of Age who cannot Read and Write.—The present Census followed the precedent of 1855, with the additional entry of an initial or other abbreviation for marking those who could read in a foreign language and not in English. The total number of illiterate was reported at 95,865, and was distributed by counties and nationalities, as shown by the accompanying table:

INQUIRIES CONCERNING SUCH INFIRMITIES AS MAY BECOME A PUBLIC CHARGE, FOR EDUCATION, MEDICAL TREAT-MENT OR MAINTENANCE.—In former Census enumerations, a column for entering the words "Deaf and Dumb," "Blind," "Insane," or "Idiotic," opposite the name of such persons as might happen to be thus afflicted, afforded the only opportunity for ascertaining statistics concerning these unfortunate classes.

In the present Census, an attempt was made to obtain much more ample details upon this subject, and for this end, a special table was provided on the last page of each population blank. A narrow column upon each page, afforded a chance for reference to this special blank, where the additional facts desired

concerning these classes were recorded. By this method, there were obtained, in addition to the usual personal statistics of the individual, the following:

- 1. The particular kind of Infirmity, as Deaf and Dumb, Blind, Insane or Idiotic.
- 2. The Duration of Infirmity, if recent, in months, or if congenital "from birth."
- 3. The cause, if known, with as much specification as possible.
- 4. The relatives that had been similarly affected, with the view of determining the influence of hereditary
- 5. Treatment in an Asylum or, special institution, public or private, and the result of such treatment.
- 6. Dependance for support, whether upon public or private means, and if partly upon each, a fraction denoting such part.
- 7. Ability to earn a living by labor, or if partly dependent, a fraction indicating degree of ability.
- 8. Residence in a poor house or other public charitable institution for maintenance of the infirm.
- 9. Whether accustomed to solict alms.
- 10. Remarks, including any circumstance peculiar to the case, or instructive as showing cause, the influence of intemperate habits in the individual or his parents, &c.

The method was successful in its operation and could not well be improved, unless by repeating the special blank, at the foot of each page, with a space of one or two lines in each, for receiving the additional references of the page, and thus in a great degree avoid the occasional (but very uncommon) accident arising from a mistake in the reference.

In classifying the results of these particular inquiries, no attempt was made to keep distinct by counties the facts relating to hereditary influences, causes, age at which the infirmity commenced, number under medical treatment, dependence for support, maintenance in charitable institutions, &c. These data collected for the whole State, are below. Those relating to sex, civil condition, nationality, age and occupations, are tabulated by-counties on pages 210 to 221, in the body of the volume.

It should be remembered that these inquiries were addressed by non-professional men, and often answered by those who had but an imperfect knowledge of the true causes and sometimes of the history of the case. It would therefore be found impossible to guard against errors in the original reports in some instances, nor could the causes assigned for the infirmity be in every way free from the influence of ignorance and superstition. Taken, however, with these allowances, they are probably the best that can be obtained by the Census, and must form the basis of generalizations upon this subject, until means are provided for arriving at the facts by a more exact and specific method.

Deaf and Dumb.—The number of cases reported was 1,600; of which 876 appear to have existed from birth; 20 occurred in infancy or youth, and 25 in more advanced years without cause assigned; and of 679, the supposed cause of the infirmity was given.\*

INTRODUCTION.

Idiotic.—The number classed as idiotic was 1,541, of whom the infirmity had existed from birth in 957 cases, of which 565 were males, and 392 females. In 251 males and 243 females the cause was unknown. The same difficulty was found in this class as with the insane, in determining where they should be classed. The instructions gave the following rules:

"Idiocy is a natural want of development of the mental faculties. Dementia is a loss of faculties once possessed. Either of these terms may be used, but where the latter occurs in old age, by the natural decay of the vital powers, and after a life of intelligence it should not be entered in this table. In general, a person capable of self support and the transaction of ordinary labor, should not be classed with the idiotic, although his grade of intellect may be below the general average. Many idiots are capable of a useful degree of education; it is therefore desirable to obtain full statistics of this class, although a certain degree of delicacy may attend the inquiry."

The influence of consanguinity in producing idiocy has been often remarked, but never before the present, has any specific inquiry upon this point been included in a census. The returns now published show more or less consanguinity in 219 cases.\*

Xciv Introduction.

Marriages.—In the absence of an efficient system of registration, in constant operation and enforced by legal provisions, in which the validity of the marriage contract is made to depend upon its record, we can scarcely hope to arrive at even proximate statistics upon this subject, through the agency of the census. The inquiries made by the enumerators in 1865, were similar to those in 1855, and both are manifestly deficient in the number returned. The imperfection of the returns is much more apparent in the cities, while in the rural districts it may be supposed to approximate very nearly to the actual number.

Although not claiming full credence for the actual number, the returns of one census and of one region, may be assumed to present results of equal relative value, as compared with another, and in this sense these become important elements in the study of vital statistics. The supposed uniformity of the returns of marriages in 1865, as compared with those of 1855, accidentally afford a most interesting opportunity for examining the influence of the war, and of the withdrawal of immense numbers of young men from the State, upon the number of marriages contracted within the preceding year. The results are stated in detail in the accompanying table, and in a diagram facing page lvii.

It is interesting to observe that a subject so entirely dependent upon the will of the individual, is found when applied to the masses of the population to be subordinate to a general law, which is scarcely less determinate in its operation than that of death itself. Among a given population we may with certainty predict, that a proportionate number of deaths will occur. With equal probability, we way predict that a certain number of people will marry. As the number of deaths is liable to variation, year by year, with the presence or absence of epidemics or other causes affecting human life, so the number of marriages may fluctuate under the influence of war, emigration or reasons of prospective plenty or want.\*

The returns of 1855 and 1865, enable us to deduce many interesting facts for comparison of the actual and relative ages of persons marrying. In 1855 the mean age of the husband was reported by the census as 27.69, and of the wife 22.62 years. In 1865, the mean age of the former was 28.45, and of the latter 23.27. It will be observed that females marry earlier and more rapidly than males; but that after passing the age of 22, the number of males of a given age that marry is greater. It will also be noticed, that the majority of young men who marry at an early age, select partners older than themselves, but that after three or four marriagable years are passed, the man in most cases selects a younger woman for a wife. The exception above noticed, appears in every census fully taken, and will find abundant verification with every person who has carefully observed this feature of social life. The table given on pages 222 and 223, presents many strange contrasts of youth and age, and numerous exceptions to general rules. The comparative age of those who were reported as having been married during the year preceding this and the last census, are given in diagram No. 6 on the plate facing page lvii.

Number of times Married.—A column, with this heading, was provided in the present Census, and the enumerators were directed to enter therein the figures 1, 2, 3, &c., as the case might require, opposite the name of each person now married, widowed or divorced. The inquiry had never before been made in the Census, and although most of the returns were full and satisfactory on this point, the defects of others

tended to impair the accuracy of the result. The classification, embracing only those that claimed entire confidence, was continued until it represented 2,777,478 of the population. Upon this basis the following percentages were prepared. The decimals extend to three places, and 100 represents the total husbands:

Of the widowers reported, 87.764 per cent. had been married once, 9.991 twice, 1.029 thrice, and 0.099 four times.

Of the widows reported, 92.902 per cent. had been married once, 8.117 twice, 0.061 thrice, and 0.041 four times.

Deaths.—Inquiries embracing the cause of death were first introduced in the National Census in 1850, and in the State Census in 1855. In 1865 this inquiry was limited to the deaths occurring in civil life, and excepted those happening in the military or naval service of the United States. A special blank was prepared for the latter, which embraced headings adapted to the particular wants of the subject. The results of this special inquiry, are given in the appendix to this volume in connection with the military statistics collected by the present census.

The instructions give the following directions for recording deaths that had occurred in civil life during the previous year:

"This table should include ordinary or accidental deaths in civil life, during one year. The inquiries should be answered by surviving members of the family, if the death occurred at home, but not otherwise. They should in all cases be reported in the town where they occurred. Strangers, travelers and persons not residing in the State, should be reported as belonging to the hotel or family where they died. The superintendents, keepers or managers of prisons, hospitals, asylums or similar establishments, should give the number that have died during the year in their respective institutions. Enumerators should take care to learn by inquiries of Coroners and otherwise, the whole number that have been found dead. The end of these inquiries being to ascertain the whole number of deaths within the State during the year ending June 1, 1865, care should be taken by each enumerator to embrace all such as have died in his district; but in no case, except that in the following paragraph, should a death be noted that has occurred out of his district, although of a person belonging to a family residing within the State, or even of those whose remains have been brought home for interment.

"In cases where families have removed from the town or city in which the death occurred, the inquiry should still be made of the family of such person if dying in such family, within the State, and a note should be made in the margin giving the name of the town or city in which such family resided at the time of the death of such person. Under the head of "remarks," on the last page, state any local or epidemic causes which may have varied the results from those of common years, and any epidemic diseases to which the district may be subject."

"Disease or cause of death.—Great care should be taken to get reliable information from the best sources within reach, and if necessary, by consulting the physician who attended upon the case, as to the particular disease of which the person died.

"If the death shall have been produced by any other cause than disease, the cause of death should be stated, as "drowning," "railroad accident," "falling from a building," "suicide by hanging," "legal execution," "murdered by shooting," "accidental shooting," &c., as the case may be.

"If unable to learn the cause of death, as in cases of some persons found dead, write "unknown," "found dead," &c., using such term of expression as shall suit the case. Enumerators having hospitals or other institutions of unusual mortality in their districts, should at once notify the Secretary of State, when they will be furnished by mail with blanks for fuller entries of deaths, than the average supply."

The total number of deaths reported under the above instructions, was 46 297 in 1855; and 37,297 in 1865.\* With a full knowledge of the comparative merits of the two enumerations as regards general care

and accuracy, and making reasonable allowance for the deaths reported in the military returns, and which might have happened to the individual had he remained in civil life. We have no hesitation in stating our belief, that the Census of 1865, was, in this respect, taken with increased care. The "remarks" that accompany each report, although too diversified for classification or summary in the great majority of cases, represent the preceding year as one of unusual health. The only epidemic of particular importance reported was diphtheria, a disease which from being unknown in the mortality statistics of former years, has come to number thousands annually as its victims among the population of our State.

Deaths from Consumption, classified by Nationality, Age, Sex and Season.—The following table embraces all the facts reported concerning this disease, and includes the various complications in which it was mentioned as "measles and consumption," &c. The absence of a record of months, age or other circumstance, renders the totals somewhat different from the number (6.041) given by counties, on pages 244—245 of this volume. It is to be remarked, that the cases reported as occuring in early childhood, or advanced age, are very liable to error, but we have not felt at liberty to attempt any correction, Many of the former were probably marasmus, or other infantile disease, while the latter were often perhaps but the natural decay of the vital powers.

DWELLINGS AND FAMILIES.—The present Census followed the form of that of 1855, and sought to obtain the material and value of every dwelling.\* The result, as compared with the last Census, shows a great increase in the number of stone and brick houses, and a corresponding decrease in the number of log cabins. The details, by towns and counties, will be found on pages 254—273, but are in the present case extended to include in a separate table the number of unoccupied dwellings.

In 1855 there were reported in the thirteen cities 2,346 houses of stone, 48,318 of brick, 54,933 framed. 79 of logs and 1,692 other. In 1865 there were —of stone, 5,192, worth \$98,590,950; of brick, 62,048. worth \$425,966,345; framed, 66,856, worth \$126,766,333; of logs, 130, worth \$158,890; and of other, 4.472, worth \$2,796,928. The number of families in 1855 was 663,124, with an average of 5.23 persons to each. In 1865 the number was 790,931 and the average 4.80.

In 1855 the number of families exceeded that of houses by 140,799, while in 1865 this excess was 196,886, indicating that of these numbers two or more families resided in the same house.

A block of stores and offices, or a manufactory of great value, may have one or more tenants in the attic or basement. As one of the obvious purposes of the inquiry is to ascertain the comparative opulence of the people in their domestic accommodations, it is obvious that the result would be seriously impaired by including them, while the aggregates for obtaining the average number of families to a house would be deficient without them. The instructions directed as follows:

"By a dwelling house is meant a separate inhabited tenement, having one or more families under one roof. Where several tenements are in one block, with walls either of brick or wood to divide them, having separate entrances, they are each to be numbered as separate houses, but where

#### AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS.

The earliest attempt to procure Agricultural Statistics throughout this State, was made by the Society for the Promotion of Agriculture, Arts and Manufactures,\* in 1791. In their first Circular Letter addressed to the friends and promoters of Rural Economy, they proposed a series of queries under eleven different heads, viz: Manures; Soils; Tillage; Stock; Grain; Grasses; Fruit trees; Forest trees; Vermin; Bees and Silk Worms and Manufactures. Under each of these were embraced several questions having reference to the increase of profit, improvement in cultivation, the introduction of new methods, the prevention, treatment of injurious tendencies, and the increase and diffusion of correct knowledge upon all subjects bearing upon the productive industry of the State.

In 1819, a Board of Agriculture was incorporated by the State Legislature, and in 1820 it addressed a Circular of Inquiries, in pamphlet form, to the several County Societies formed under its auspices, embracing in four schedules a great variety of questions requiring numerical returns and descriptive statements. With the exception of an able and carefully prepared "Statistical Report of the County of Albany, for the year 1820," by John Preston, there was no attempt made to collect and arrange the materials required in these interrogatories. In 1821, Agricultural Statistics were first embraced in the State Census, including only the number of acres of improved land, and the number of neat cattle, horses and sheep. In 1825 and 1835, the same inquiries were used, with the addition of swine to the list of domestic animals.

In 1840, the number of horses, mules, cattle, sheep and swine, and the value of poultry were ascertained. The number of bushels of wheat, barley, oats, rye, buckwheat and corn, the pounds of wool, hops and wax, the bushels of potatoes, the tons of hay and of hemp and flax, the pounds of sugar made, and cords of wood sold, the value of the products of the dairy, orchard, and market garden, the gallons of wine made, and the number of men employed, and capital invested in nuseries, were also ascertained.

In 1845, to the above inquiries in reference to live stock and amount of product of the cereal grains and root crops, was added the amount of land devoted to each separate crop. The censuses of 1850 and 1855 adopted similar inquiries, in addition to which, the latter provided for the return of unenumerated articles of farm produce, and the amount, kind and value of special manures employed. The summaries of the earlier returns are given in the introduction to the Census of 1855. It is therefore deemed sufficient in this connection to compare the totals of the Census of 1855 with those of 1865, and to present the aggregates and summaries of the last two Federal enumerations:

CIV INTRODUCTION.

Unfortunately for favorable returns, the Census of 1865 embraced the crop of a season unprecedented for the length and severity of its drouth. The early spring months of 1864 were attended with heavy rains, and the floods which they occasioned, especially in the Genesee Valley, were quite destructive. These rains were followed by a drouth, commencing in the first week in June, and continuing till September,\* It was most injurious in the northern and western parts of the State, and in some of the western counties the injuries from this cause were further increased by clouds of grasshoppers, which consumed the little herbage that the drouth had spared. Under a clear sky and a burning sun the earth became parched and cracked to quite a depth. Grain and pasture fields became scorched and dry, and the spring grains were in numerous localities an entire failure. Meadows, from the start they got in the spring, were less injured than had been apprehended, and the heavy fall rains brought forward the potato crop to a full average, and sometimes an abundant yield. In some cases the rot appeared after this crop was harvested, which was attributed to their rapid growth. These autumnal rains rendered it difficult to harvest the bean crop, and occasioned extensive losses in those counties where it is principally cultivated. Hops were in many localities injured, and often destroyed, by an Aphis, or plant louse.

Disease among Farm Stock.—Enumerators were directed to report, in connection with agricultural statistics, such facts as they might ascertain relative to epidemic diseases among domestic animals, with the number of deaths and recoveries, the season when they occurred, the symptoms of disease, and such modes of treatment as had proved successful. These inquiries proved nearly barren of results.\*

Cheese Factories.—A special blank was prepared for including returns from this branch of industry. It included the name of manufacturer or company, date of beginning, cost of buildings and apparatus, average number of men and women employed, average and greatest number of cows, day of beginning and ending for the season, cost of labor, pounds of milk used and of cheese made, shrinkage, selling price, cost of making, amount of salt used, market to which sold, and general remarks.

Returns, more or less complete, were received from 456 factories, of which one was established in 1850, four in 1844, two in 1855, three in 1856, three in 1857, four in 1858, four in 1859, seventeen in 1860, eighteen in 1861, twenty-five in 1862, one hundred and twelve in 1863, two hundred and eleven in 1864, and fifty-two in 1865.

It will be observed that the greater part have been commenced since the beginning of the war, and that they were evidently made necessary by the scarcity of labor which it occasioned. Of many started in 1864, only a part of the season was reported, while for 1865 only the cost of buildings and apparatus, number of hands employed and number of cows could be given. From these necessary deficiences of parts of the season, etc., the total summary presents an aggregate of results which would not admit of use in calculating the profits of the business or the general percentages which it involves. We have therefore presented, in a separate table, the individual returns of one hundred and thirty-three factories using the milk of three hundred cows and upwards through the season of 1864, from which the details of the business in the various counties may be studied and compared.

It is to be remarked that some discrepancies between the quantities of cheese made in factories, as shown by these tables, and the quantity reported by farmers and given in the general tables of agricultural statistics will appear.

The instructions directed the amount of cheese made to be reported by the owners of cows, whether made on the premises or at a factory. In the latter case the amount was to be ascertained by computing the share of cheese from the relative amount of milk furnished, or of money received, at a given rate per pound.

The manufacturer of the cheese was required to report, as a part of the statistics of his business (and not as a part of the production of the country in this article), the quantity of cheese made at his factory. This would of course be a duplicate of the quantity reported by the farmers. But it sometimes happened that the owner of the cows neglected to report his share of cheese made at the factory. For this omission no remedy could be applied when the tables were prepared at the office, and on this account the quantity of cheese made, as given in the agricultural tables, falls short of the amount actually produced.

It is further to be observed that the dry summer of 1865, to which the tables refer, tended to reduce the amount of butter and cheese in most localities below the average of common years. In some cases the failure was specified as a third, quarter, etc., and probably the true deficiency from the drouth exceeded twenty-five per cent. in general average of the State.†

Of the markets to which the cheese of factories was sold, 341 were to New York, five to Philadelphia, three to St. Louis, two to Chicago, two to Cincinnati, one to Buffalo and one to Montreal. The remainder not specified.

The time during which the factories were run averaged from the first week in May to the first week in November.

The quantity of salt used to 100 pounds of cheese was reported from 377 factories. In 101 of these the amount was three pounds; in 88, two and a half; in 51, two and three-quarters; in 40, two and seven tenths; in 19, two and four fifths; in 9, two, and in 6, five. The least quantity used was '3 of a pound. In Limburg cheese the amount is much larger, being in 12 cases, fourteen; in 10, twelve; in 5, fifteen; in 3, sixteen, and in 1, seventeen pounds.

<sup>\*</sup> In several of the western counties flocks of sheep were reported as being affected by grub in the head, foot rot, and scab. The cause assigned, by several intelligent persons, was poor keeping, and the aggregation of large flocks in the same enclosure, and a marked improvement was noticed on a removal of these causes. The grub was found to affect lambs more than old sheep, and the disease was noticed as most prevalent in February and March. A farmer in Oakfield, Genesee Co., having a flock of six hundred sheep, cured about one hundred cases of foot rot by using the following: Butter of antimony, 2 oz.; sulphuric acid, 2 oz.; vinegar, 1 pint, mixed and applied two or three times, at intervals of six days. For the scab, lime, salt and sulphur were successfully applied, and cures were effected by washing with strong decoctions of tobacco. For this purpose a vat was used with a perforated board, on which the animal was laid, and the liquid thus prevented from waste.

Among the dairying districts of Central New York, abortion in cows has proved a serious loss to the farmer. In Norway, Herkimer Co., 131 cases were reported as happening from three or four months up to seven and eight. Nearly all of the latter cows were brought to their milk, and about half of the whole number were fit only to be fed for beef. No satisfactory cause has been assigned for this serious casualty.

Manufactures.—A historical notice of the earlier census returns relating to manufactures having been given in the Census of 1855, (Introduction, pages lv. to lxi,) it is deemed sufficient in this place to refer to that volume for whatever relates to the enumerations previous to 1850. The statistics of manufactures obtained by the Census of 1850, for reasons very generally understood, but never officially stated, were withheld from the public several years, and were not finally published until 1859, when they had lost nearly all their interest for practical applications, and served only for historical reference.\*

In the present Census the inquiries were the same as in the last, excepting that there was but one column for entering the amount of capital, the subdivision into capital invested "in real estate" and "in tools and machinery," being omitted. The classification, as before, was made to correspond with that of the American Patent Office, but separate columns were provided for noting the number of establishments reporting each subject.

The rate of wages of men and women is given in a separate table, and general summaries of classes were added.

With the view of obtaining more definite information concerning certain branches of industry, special blanks were prepared with specific inquiries, and the result of this measure, now first introduced in our Census, was sufficiently complete to justify its continuance in future censuses.†

The States, when arranged in the order of their relative amount of manufactures, show New York at the head of the column, and the aggregates as given in the following table:

The present Census embraces returns from 24,527 establishments, with a capital of \$227,674,187, and an aggregate value of product amounting to \$463,609,877. The statistics reported by the special blanks are included in these totals.

The Federal Census of 1860 reported 22,624 establishments, \$172,895,652 capital, and \$378,870,930 of products. When it is considered that the Census of 1865 refers to the year 1864, and a period when the best energies of the nation were being applied in suppressing the Southern rebellion, this extraordinary increase affords a striking evidence of the immense resources of the State of New York. A part of the increase in values is doubtless to be attributed to the general advance of prices; but the growing number of establishments clearly indicates an expansion of business, and a corresponding return of profits.

These statistics do not include the Methodist Church South. They include the Germany and Switzerland and the Liberia Mission Conferences beyond the limits of the United States.

The Conferences are established without regard to State lines. Three of these lie wholly within the State of New York, and six extend into neighboring States. They are divided into Districts, as follows: Black River Conference.—Rome, Syracuse, Camden, Oswego, Adams, Watertown, Ogdensburgh and Potsdam Districts, all in New York.

East Genesee Conference—Rochester, Geneva, Penn Yan, Elmira and Hornellsville Districts, in New York, and Troy District, in Pennsylvania.

Erie Conference.—Three Districts in Ohio, four in Pennsylvania, and Jamestown and Fredonia Districts, in New York.

Genesee Conference.—Buffalo, Niagara, Genesee, Wyoming and Olean Districts, all in New York.

New York Conference.—New York, Poughkeepsie, Rhinebeck, Prattsville, Ellenville and Newburgh Districts, in New York; German Mission District, partly in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

New York East Conference.—New York and Long Island Districts, in New York; Bridgeport and New Haven Districts, in Connecticut.

Oneida Conference.—Chenango, Otsego, Oneida, Cortland, Auburn and Cazenovia Districts, all in New York.

Troy Conference.—Troy, Albany, Saratoga and Plattsburgh Districts, in New York; Poultney District, partly in Vermont and Massachusetts.

Wyoming Conference.—Four Districts in Pennsylvania; Binghamton and Owego Districts in New York.

Presbyterian Church.—The two divisions of this church were not reported so that we could with certainty distinguish between the Old School and the New School, and they are classified together. They are organized respectively in the State of New York, as follows:

Old School.—Thirty-five Synods in the United States, of which those of Albany, Buffalo and New York include this State, with other territory.

Albany Synod comprises the Albany, Londonderry, Mohawk, Siam and Troy Presbyteries, of which three are chiefly in New York State,

Buffalo Synod comprises the Buffalo City, Genesee River, Ogdensburgh and Rochester City Presbyteries.

New York Synod comprises the Canton, Connecticut, Hudson, Long Island, Nassau, New York, New York Second, Wingapo, North River and West African Presbyteries, of which six are chiefly in this State.

New School.—Twenty-two Synods in the United States, of which those of Albany, Genesee, Geneva, New York and New Jersey, Onondaga, Susquehanna and Utica include the State of New York, with adjacent territory.

Albany Synod comprises the Albany, Catskill, Champlain, Columbia and Troy Presbyteries.

Genesee Synod comprises the Buffalo, Genesee, Genesee Valley, Niagara, Ontario and Rochester Presbyteries.

Geneva Synod comprises the Chemung, Geneva, Ithaca, Lyons, Steuben and Wellsborough Presbyteries.

New York and New Jersey Synod comprises the Brooklyn, Hudson, Long Island, Montrose, Newark,

New York Third, New York Fourth, North River and Rockaway Presbyteries.

Onondaga Synod comprises the Cayuga, Cortland, Onondaga and Tioga Presbyteries.

Susquehanna Syncd comprises the Chenango, Delaware, and Otsego Presbyteries.

Utica Synod comprises the Oswego, St. Lawrence, Utica and Watertown Presbyteries.

United Presbyterian Church.—This church, formed a few years since by the union of the Associate and Associate Reformed Presbyterians, reported in 1863, in the United States, 45 Presbyteries, 464 ministers, 682 churches, 54,758 communicants and \$305,082 raised for all causes. The Albany, Argyle, Caledonia, New York First, New York Second and St. Lawrence Presbyteries, in the State of New York, numbered together 55 ministers, 47 churches and 6,698 communicants.

Reformed Protestant Dutch Church.—The General Synod of this church in North America is subdivided into the Particular Synods of New York, Albany and Chicago, having sixteen, twelve and four classes respectively. The following summary represents the details as reported by the denomination in the State of New York in 1865:

Roman Catholic Church.—Of this denomination there are in the United States, 7 Archiepiscopal Sees, 5 Vicariates Apostolic and 44 Dioceses. The Province of New York includes New England, New York and New Jersey, forming 9 Dioceses, of which 4 are in New York.

The Diocese of New York (formed in 1808) includes the counties south of 42° north latitude, except Long Island.

The Diocese of Albany (formed in 1847) includes all of the State north of 42° north latitude and east of Cayuga, Tompkins and Tioga counties.

The Diocese of Buffalo (formed in 1847) includes the counties of Cayuga, Tompkins and Tioga and all the counties west of these in this State.

The Diocese of Brooklyn (formed in 1853) includes Long Island.

The Diocese of New York has 32 city, and 62 country churches, 25 chapels, 24 institutions, 15 select schools, 35 parish schools and 11 asylums and hospitals.

That of Albany has about 120 churches, 8 chapels, about 60 stations, 3 academies for boys, and 2 for girls, and 6 orphan asylums, besides a large number of parochial schools.

That of Buffalo has 160 churches, 30 stations, 4 ecclesiastical institutions, 9 male and 17 female religious institutions, 5 male and 17 female literary institutions, and 14 charitable institutions. It claims a Catholic population of 200,000.

That of Brooklyn has 49 churches, 11 institutions and 14 parish schools.

EDUCATIONAL STATISTICS.—In the State Census of 1855 inquiries were made concerning the materials, condition and value of public school houses. As these facts come within the province of the Department of Public Instruction, and as the data relating to academies and higher literary institutions of the State are mostly included in the reports made to the Regents of the University, it was thought proper to omit these, and to include in the Census only such inquiries as relate to unincorporated and private seminaries from which no official reports are otherwise made.\*

The number reported was 110, of which 10 were owned by stock companies, 15 by churches and religious bodies and 84 by individuals. Their date of establishment was as follows: 1828, one; 1832, one; 1834, one; 1835, two; 1836, one; 1837, one; 1838, two; 1839, one; 1840, one; 1845, one; 1849, two; 1850, five; 1851, three; 1852, four; 1853, three; 1854, one; 1855, seven; 1856, three; 1858, four; 1859, four; 1860, four; 1861, six; 1862, two; 1863, nine.

POOR HOUSES, ORPHAN ASYLUMS AND HOSPITALS.—No inquiries relating to these institutions were made by the Census on former occasions, and the statistics given in the present volume therefore stand without data for previous comparison. The officers having charge cheerfully responded to the inquiries, with scarcely an exception; and the information thus obtained will, it is believed, prove reliable and useful for present use and future reference.

Inns, Stores and Groceries.—Returns having been made under these heads in 1845 and 1855, it was deemed proper to obtain data for comparison in the present Census. The result was as follows:

Newspapers and other Periodicals.—These statistics were obtained in the same manner as in the last State Census, and fourteen volumes of specimen numbers, embracing very nearly the entire series, with a few of later issue not embraced in the tables, have been placed in the State library. The corresponding series in 1855 filled eleven volumes.

In 1775 there were 4 newspapers printed in the colony of New York. In 1810 there were 66 papers, with an aggregate annual circulation of 7,139,200 sheets. In 1828 there were 161 newspapers and periodicals, and in 1832 the number had increased to 268. In 1839 there were 307 periodicals. The number and total annual circulation as shown by successive census returns have since been as follows:

Indian Census.—The Census of Indians residing upon Reservations is taken by enumerators appointed by the Secretary of State and paid directly from the State treasury. Of the \$500 appropriated for this purpose but \$288 was used. Upon the Allegany, Cattaraugus, Tonawanda and Tuscarora Reservations intelligent and educated members of the tribe were appointed to take the census, and in the others citizens were commissioned to perform this duty. The returns, with comparisons from the Censuses of 1845 and 1855, are fully given on pages 600–607. It will be observed that the number of Indians is slowly increasing, with a corresponding improvement in their resources and industrial products, and that these statistics encourage the hope of much greater advancement in material prosperity and intellectual attainments.

#### STATISTICS OF THE WAR.

In the Appendix we have presented statistics relating to the war as fully as the mat rials reported would allow. From reasons fully stated elsewhere, these are not so complete as could be wished, but they are probably as accurate as could under the most favorable circumstances be obtained through the agency of the Census. By the favor of James M. Moore, Brevet Lt. Col. and Assist. Q. M. of the Army, we have been enabled to present in this connection some data obtained by Government concerning the burial of New York soldiers in the cemeteries adjacent to hospitals and battle-fields, which have an interesting relation to these returns. Yet even the most careful researches sustained by the highest authority must fail in attempting to discover the full and accurate amount of loss in human life which the late war has occasioned.
