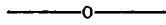

NUMBER AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS USED AS COUNTY POOR HOUSES, WITH MISCELLANEOUS REMARKS.



ALBANY.—The Alms House is located in the city of Albany, about a mile and a half southwest from the Capitol, and consists of six buildings of brick. The dimensions of five of them are returned as follows: 160 by 30; 120 by 40; 120 by 20; 120 by 20, and an Insane Asylum 120 by 30 feet. No account was kept of the receipts from crops and labor, which went to assist in the support of the establishment. The value of the Poor House buildings was estimated at \$14,000.

ALLEGANY.—The County Poor House consists of one main building of stone 36 by 150 feet, with two wings 27 by 36 feet. The first story of one wing is of stone, and the remainder of wood. There is no school kept on the premises, the children being accommodated at a public school half a mile distant, from six to seven months in the year. The receipts reported in the table include what has been sold from the farm, and the expense of maintenance is what is over and above the produce of the farm. The buildings valued at \$4,000.

BROOME.—Four wooden buildings constitute the Poor House of this county. The men's department is 30 by 70, and that occupied by women is 30 by 40 feet. Insane department 16 by 24 feet, and another for idiotic, 20 by 30 feet.

CATTARAUGUS.—Four wooden buildings reported, viz: One 90 by 36; two 20 by 30, and one 20 by 20. The latter is the wash-house.

CAYUGA.—The main building is of brick, 95 by 60 feet, erected in 1858. Pest-house 20 by 30 feet, framed. Wash-house 40 by 50, framed. The establishment is located three and a half miles north of Auburn, and is reported in good condition, the yard being finely ornamented with trees, and the surroundings kept in a neat and tasteful manner. The buildings valued at \$15,000.

CHAUTAQUA.—Twelve buildings are reported. The main one of brick, two stories high, 30 by 140 feet; one of wood 26 by 40 feet; one of brick 30 by 40 feet; one of wood 26 by 50 feet; one of wood 22 by 30 feet; a barn 30 by 50 feet, and other wooden buildings 30 by 46, 40 by 40, 36 by 36, and 20 by 22 feet. The expense reported for maintenance, is in addition to the receipts from the farm. The main buildings valued at \$2,000.

CHEMUNG.—All the buildings of wood, viz: Upright part of main building, 40 by 60 feet; one wing, 24 by 100 feet; one wing, 26 by 30 feet; a horse barn, 30 by 50 feet; a grain barn, 30 by 40 feet; a corn barn, 18 by 60 feet; a shed, 16 by 30 feet, and a sty and corn house, 18 by 24 feet. A recent change of keepers, prevented the census enumerator from obtaining full statistics of the preceding year. The main building valued at \$2,500.

CHENANGO.—The main structure is a frame building, 30 feet front by 56 deep, three stories high, with two wings, each of two stories, 34 by 38 feet. Two rear wings also, two stories high, are 28 by 34 feet, and cellars exist under the whole. An Insane department, framed, 26 by 46 feet, two stories high. Two barns, 36 by 70 and 34 by 44 feet, with three hay barns and other out buildings. The buildings valued at \$8,000.

CLINTON.—The house is built of stone, 30 by 60 feet, two and a half stories high, with a wing one and a half story, 24 by 50 feet. Valued on the population schedule at \$2,000. There were two barns, 30 by 40 feet each; a cow barn, 30 by 40; a horse barn, 20 by 40; a wood house, 30 by 60, and corn house, 20 by 30. Although not capable of accommodating over 60, the buildings at times, have had from 100 to 140 persons crowded into them. The buildings are old, and the concern poorly conducted.

COLUMBIA.—The main building is 40 by 44 feet, with two wings, each 66 by 40 feet; a lunatic asylum, 46 by 30 feet, of brick, and 40 by 30 feet, of wood; wood house and smoke house, 50 by 39 feet, of wood; hog pen and slaughter house, 60 by 36, of wood; barn, 35 by 50 feet; horse barn, 26 by 40; shed, 20 by 36; pork house, 18 by 26, and other out buildings. No contagious diseases had appeared during the year, and the farm had been productive in everything but oats and corn, which had been affected by drouth.

CORTLAND.—Main building, 36 by 26, with a wing, 22 by 90 feet; barn 54 by 30, with a wing 54 by 18; woodshed, 38 by 24 feet; school house, 22 by 24 feet; shop, 26 by 24 feet; corn house, 24 by 16 feet. The cells are 24 by 26 feet, and all of wood. Value of edifice \$1,400.

DELAWARE.—Two buildings are reported. The main building was erected two years since, and is framed, three stories and a basement, 108

by 56 feet; it is heated by a furnace, and cost \$7,300. The other building is for the insane, 26 by 36 feet, two stories and basement, warmed by hot air, and valued at \$600. The premises were erected in a substantial manner, and were reported as neatly kept.

DUTCHESS.—The main building of wood, 32 by 130 feet, with slate roof; basement of brick and stone; asylum for insane, 22 by 34 feet, of wood, the first story being filled with brick; barn, 30 by 40 feet; wash-house, 20 by 30 feet; school house and lodging rooms, 24 by 40 feet, with slate roof, and other out-buildings.

ERIE.—There are two main buildings that constitute the county Poor House. The principal one is four stories high, 40 by 180 feet. The Insane house is 40 by 118 feet, two stories high, outer halls, two, of which one is 40 by 40, and the other 26 by 50 feet, two stories high. All but the last mentioned are of stone.

ESSEX.—One main building two stories high, of wood, 80 by 30 feet. There is a district school near by, at which children from the house attend.

FRANKLIN.—Building of wood, and old, 90 by 36 feet, one and a half stories. Three barns, 30 by 40; 20 by 40; and 40 by 60 feet. Granary 20 by 30. Separate room for men 20 by 30, and old buildings. The amount received from farm (\$150) is exclusive of that consumed on the farm.

FULTON.—One main building of wood, two stories high, 80 by 30 feet, valued at \$1,000. No school is kept on the premises, as there is a district school in the neighborhood.

GENESEEE.—One building of brick, 30 by 40 feet; one of stone, 30 by 40 feet, and three framed, 40 by 50; 26 by 30, and 20 by 24 feet. The latter is the laundry. The buildings are said to be well ventilated and neatly kept.

GREENE.—Built of wood, and in three departments; 30 by 45; 20 by 120, and 20 by 120 feet. Buildings valued at \$5,000.

HAMILTON.—No poor house in this county.

HERKIMER.—There are five buildings connected with the establishment, of stone, three stories, 40 by 80 feet. The children are sent to orphan asylum at Utica for instruction. [In the N. Y. Gazetteer it is stated that there are two main buildings of stone, each 30 by 46 feet.]

JEFFERSON.—Main building of stone, 40 by 100 feet; one of brick, 25 by 70 feet, and a wash house of stone, 20 by 25 feet. Located on the banks of the Black river, a mile below the village of Watertown.

KINGS.—Alms House of brick, 180 by 60 feet, four stories high. Hospital of brick, 300 by 75 feet, four stories high. Asylum 450 feet long, and a nursery.

LEWIS.—Main building of stone, 40 by 60 feet, two stories high. A Lunatic Asylum of brick, 30 by 40, and a wooden building used as the keeper's residence, with the usual out-buildings. The value of products was estimated at \$1,400, all of which was consumed on the place.

LIVINGSTON.—Poor House located in Geneseo, a mile east of the village. Main building 108 by 53 feet, built of brick. There is a wooden building 60 by 20 feet, for lunatics.

MADISON.—The upright part of the main building is two stories high, with a basement, and built of stone. Two wings of stone, two stories high, making a front of 114 feet. An Insane Asylum hospital and school room are built of stone, with barns, sheds, &c., on the opposite side of the public road. Reported as neatly kept. Value of building \$2,000.

MONROE.—The Alms House of this county consists of five buildings, viz., hospital, of brick, 60 by 30 feet. Two buildings of brick, 90 by 32, and 80 by 35 feet; a wooden school house 25 by 50 feet, and another wooden building, 46 by 28 feet.

MONTGOMERY.—Two buildings of wood, 100 by 26, and 90 by 40 feet, and one of brick, 30 by 70 feet. They are all two stories in height. Value of principal one, \$1,500.

NEW YORK.—No reports received concerning the buildings, &c., of the

Alms Houses on Blackwell's Island. They consist of two separate and similar structures, 650 feet apart, for the two sexes, and are each composed of a main building and wings, and arranged with strict regard to comfort and economy. They are under the direction of the Commissioners of Charities and Correction.

NIAGARA.—Six buildings reported, viz.: main edifice, 45 by 70 feet, three and a half stories high; Male Department 38 by 55 feet, two and a half stories; Children's Department, 28 by 36 feet, of same height; Hospital, 28 by 38 feet, two stories; Insane Asylum, 30 by 46 feet, three stories, and pest house, 14 by 24 feet, one story high.

ONEIDA.—Main building 50 by 76 feet, with two wings, 50 by 87 feet; Asylum, 120 by 35 feet. Both are built of brick. During the year 23 males and 9 females had died. Number of blind, deaf and dumb and idiotic, 23.

ONONDAGA.—Main building 40 by 80 feet, three stories and basement. Adjoining this, there is one 39 by 56 feet, two stories and basement. Asylum, 33 by 75 feet, two stories and basement. All the buildings are of stone. The number reported as under 18 years are mostly small infants, as the greater number of pauper children in the county are sent to the Onondaga County Orphan Asylum.

ONTARIO.—Six buildings are reported. The main structure is of brick and wood, 40 by 84 feet, two stories and a basement, with two wings. One of these is two stories, 32 by 60 feet, and the other one and a half stories, 25 by 30 feet; wood and wash house, 18 by 96 feet; barns, 26 by 100, and 32 by 44 feet; corn house, 30 by 32 feet; school house, 18 by 24 feet.

ORANGE.—Main building of stone, three stories high, 44 by 100 feet; new barn with slate roof, 32 by 60 feet; wagon house, 25 by 60 feet; granary, 20 by 28 feet; barn, 26 by 94 feet; mill, 16 by 34 feet; coal house, 19 by 30 feet; laundry, 24 by 30 feet of stone; lean-to to house, 16 by 44 feet; Asylum, of stone, 32 by 40 feet.

ORLEANS.—One main building, 45 by 55 feet, of brick, two stories high. One wing, 18 by 72 feet, of brick, two stories high. One dwelling for superintendent, 20 by 30 feet, of wood; with a wing, 14 by 20 feet.

Barn, 30 by 50 feet. Horse barn, 20 by 30 feet. Carriage house, 16 by 20 feet, and other out-buildings. Value of principal structure \$3,000.

OSWEGO.—Poorhouse, two stories high, 32 by 65 feet, of wood; with two wings, one of brick and the other of wood. Asylum, of brick, three stories high, 32 by 68 feet.

OTSEGO.—Four buildings: Two three-story, stone, 94 by 24 feet. One two-story, wood, 94 by 24 feet. One Asylum, three-story, wood, 64 by 24 feet. This establishment is located on the east bank of the Susquehanna, four miles south of Cooperstown. The Asylum for the insane is mentioned as being finely constructed and well kept.

PUTNAM.—Two buildings, framed, 124 by 30, and 16 by 20 feet.

QUEENS.—Three framed buildings: 40 by 20; 30 by 20; and another, used as an hospital, 30 by 20 feet. The town poorhouses partly relieve the county from the care of the poor in Queens county.

RENSSELAER.—There are three main buildings of brick and stone, occupied as the Rensselaer County House of Industry, their sizes being 135 by 40, 56 by 31, and 64 by 32 feet. The premises are noticed as neatly kept, and the inmates as well cared for.

RICHMOND.—One stone building, three stories and a basement, with 20 rooms. One brick building, two stories and a basement, with 7 rooms. The keeper's house, framed, two stories, with 12 rooms. School house, two stories, framed, 18 by 25 feet. The labor of the inmates is estimated at \$200 per annum, and other help is employed upon the farm.

ROCKLAND.—Three buildings: One 40 by 40 feet, basement, two floors and an attic; one 36 by 40, two floors; and one 20 by 16, attached to the latter, and two stories high. Besides these, there are other suitable buildings for farm purposes.

ST. LAWRENCE.—The buildings are old, and of wood. Size of the main edifice 40 by 40 feet, with several wings connected.

SARATOGA.—An old dilapidated wooden building, 106 by 32 feet, with two wings, each 30 by 50 feet. A school is usually kept ten or eleven months, but during the previous year it had been interrupted by the small-pox.

SCHENECTADY.—Seven buildings comprise the Alms House of this county and its appendages. A keeper's residence, framed, two stories, 25 by 45 feet. Insane Asylum, brick, two stories, 32 by 50 feet. Alms House, brick, two stories, 44 by 72 feet. Alms House for colored paupers, framed, two stories, 18 by 25 feet. Wood house, framed, 18 by 35 feet. Barn, framed, 40 by 40 feet; and wagon house, framed, 22 by 30 feet. A commodious hospital, 22 by 34 feet, two stories high, and framed, was being erected. It has a wing 14 by 22 feet.

SCHOHARIE.—Main building of brick, three stories high. The "spotted fever" had prevailed, and a number of deaths had occurred during the preceding year in this establishment.

SCHUYLER.—No County Poor House.

SENECA.—Two buildings. Main edifice, 75 by 40 feet, and a wing 20 feet square.

STEBEN.—Four buildings were reported: One of brick, two stories, 40 by 80 feet; one of brick, three stories, 30 by 40 feet; one of wood, 20 by 36 feet; and another of wood, 20 by 40 feet. Value estimated at \$20,000.

SUFFOLK.—There is no County Poor House in this county, but separate establishments in most of the towns.

SULLIVAN.—Two wooden buildings are reported. Main edifice 24 by 60 feet, three stories high; with two wings, 24 feet each and two stories. Insane department, 24 by 28 feet.

TIOGA.—One stone building, 30 by 66 feet, with wing 24 by 20 feet. One wooden building, 24 by 36 feet; and one of wood, 24 by 30 feet.

TOMPKINS.—The buildings are of wood; old, out of repair and poorly adapted to the wants of the institution. They consist of a dwelling, two and a half stories high, with basement, 40 by 80 feet; with a one-story house in the rear, 20 by 30 feet, and a wing 18 by 24 feet. Wood house, 16 by 30 feet. Barn, 40 by 60 feet. Wagon house, 24 by 30 feet. School house, 18 by 24 feet. Other out-buildings.

ULSTER.—A keeper's house, 24 by 30 feet. Alms House, 32 by 120 feet. Insane Asylum, 45 by 73 feet. House for colored paupers, 22 by 30 feet. Two barns, 40 by 60 and 30 by 50 feet. Granary, 16 by 21 feet. Other out-buildings.

WARREN.—Main building of stone, 35 by 60 feet, three stories high, with slate roof. An adjoining building, 20 by 70 feet. Two barns, each 30 by 40 feet, and other out-houses.

WASHINGTON.—Two buildings of brick, two and three stories high; dimensions not reported.

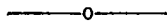
WAYNE.—Male Asylum, of brick, one story, 26 by 40 feet. Female Asylum, of brick, two stories, 30 by 60 feet. County House, of stone and wood, three stories, 60 by 60 feet. Laundry, 20 by 30 feet, framed. Wood house, framed, 16 by 40 feet. Three barns, each 30 by 40 feet.

WESTCHESTER.—Main building, 60 by 100 feet. Insane Asylum, 40 by 50 feet. Hospital, 40 by 50 feet. Pest house, 20 by 30 feet, of stone. House for colored paupers, 25 by 30 feet. Work house, 20 by 50 feet. Other out buildings.

WYOMING.—House, 38 by 40, and wing 30 by 80 feet. Wash room, 26 by 30 feet. Asylum, 36 by 38 feet. Sitting room, 26 by 30 feet. Wood house, 20 by 50 feet. School house, 20 by 26 feet. Barn, 38 by 55 feet. Shop, 20 by 30 feet; with other out-buildings for farm use. The institution is mentioned as being well conducted, and the inmates as healthy and comfortable.

YATES.—Main edifice, of stone, 36 by 64 feet. Men's house, of wood, 28 by 46 feet. Insane Asylum, 16 by 36 feet. School house, 14 by 16 feet. Barn, 30 by 56 ft. Wood house, 18 by 24 ft. Other out-buildings.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTICES AND REMARKS CONCERNING OTHER ESTABLISHMENTS
FOR THE RELIEF OF THE POOR, REPORTED BY CENSUS ENUMERATORS.



[This is given as a very imperfect statement, and as including only a small portion of the charitable institutions of the State, especially in the large cities. Still the facts thus reported are regarded as valuable items of information, and much of it can be found nowhere else in official reports.]

DUTCHESS.—Poughkeepsie city Alms House consists of several buildings, the dimensions being 32 by 130; 22 by 192; 25 by 66; 18 by 50, and 19 by 45 feet, with six others not mentioned; formerly owned by the county and used as a Poor House. It is now owned by the city and managed by commissioners.

ERIE.—St. Mary's Lying-in Hospital and St. Vincent's Foundling Asylum. Patients remaining, 105; admitted, 465; sent to other Asylums, 144; adopted in families, 59; died, 59; discharged, 87. Total received from the beginning, 1,932.

KINGS.—St. Peter's Asylum, Brooklyn, opened October, 2 1864, and conducted under the care of St. Peter's (R. C.) Church; three brick buildings, three stories high, 20 by 35 feet.

NEW YORK.—Colored Home, founded in 1845, occupies a four story brick building, 50 by 180 feet, on a lot of two acres. Value of property, \$150,000; under a board of lady managers; inmates, 40 men, 130 women, 6 boys and 3 girls; insane, 4; wholly incapable of labor, 164; expenses, \$15,000; capacity for 300.

House of Mercy, 68th street, established February 15, 1854; occupies a framed building 100 by 125 feet; value of property, \$75,000; conducted by trustees of the Protestant Episcopal denomination; inmates, 18 women, 25 girls; expenses from January 1, 1864, to October 1, 1864, \$3,476.71. Capacity for accommodation, 45.

Ladies' Union Aid Society of the Methodist Episcopal Church, located in 42d street, near 8th avenue, and founded for the benefit of aged and infirm members of the M. E. Church. Established in 1850; occupies a building of stone and brick 60 by 80 feet; value of property, \$45,000; inmates, 3 men, 59 women, all of whom are incapable of labor. The house will accommodate 100. Expenses in 1864, \$5,381.71; receipts, \$4,826.17, derived from subscriptions, donations, festivals and collections in churches.

Imperfect reports from several other charitable institutions in New York city were received, but not with sufficient detail for publication.

ORANGE.—Newburgh town Alms House, established by act of March 23, 1853. Its main building is of brick, 45 by 54 feet, with a wing 27 by 63 feet; hospital 22 by 30 feet; barn 36 by 27 feet; carriage house 28 by 76 feet.

QUEENS.—The town Poor House of Hempstead is one framed building,

22 feet square, with a wing 12 by 16 feet. The poor are let to be kept by the one who will keep them for the smallest sum.

The Jones' Institute of Oyster Bay is supported by the Jones' fund, formed in 1836, by a gift of \$30,000 from Samuel Jones, and since increased by a gift of \$5,000 from the late Walter R. Jones. After supporting the poor of Oyster Bay the charity applies to North Hempstead, and after this to Flushing. The buildings were erected for farm purposes, and the institution is managed by three trustees chosen from Oyster Bay and two from North Hempstead. Receipts for the year ending April 1, 1865, \$3,456.07; expenses, \$3,399.97. Whole number supported during the year, 105; of whites from Oyster Bay, 61; do from North Hempstead, 38; number of blacks, 54; deaths during the year, 4 whites, 1 black; inventoried value of household goods, stock and farming utensils, \$2,517.53.

Flushing Town Farm; main building of wood, 30 by 125 feet, with one brick wing 12 by 25 feet. The farm, with the poor, are let to the lowest approved bidder.

Jamaica Town Poor House, 30 by 60 feet, one and a half stories. The building is old and dilapidated. The keeping of the house is let at a given price per week for board, the overseer furnishing clothing. The present rate of board is \$2.50. ‡

RICHMOND.—Sailor's Snug Harbor. We have no returns of this institution. It was founded upon a bequest of Robert Richard Randall, of New York, who, by will dated June 1, 1801, gave the residue of an estate which has become very valuable, for the endowment of an institution for the support of aged and infirm sailors. The premises are ample, beautifully arranged, and neatly kept.

The Mariner's Family Asylum occupies a building of brick, five stories in height, 60 by 70 feet.

SUFFOLK.—The Brookhaven Alms House is about 24 by 40 feet.

The East Hampton Poor House occupies a wooden building 27 by 38 feet, one and a half stories high. In addition to the numbers reported in the table, several indigent persons are assisted. Total expense of poor in 1864, \$2,200.19.

Huntington Alms House; size of building 30 by 45 feet; framed. About 50 are supported outside of the Town house. Expenses in 1864, \$2,500.

The Riverhead Poor House is a framed building, 30 feet square, with other farm buildings adjacent.

Smithtown. Poor House a wooden framed building, 30 by 40 feet. Besides those supported in the house 14 are aided by the town, but reside with friends.

Southampton. Poor House of wood, two stories, 38 feet square.

Southold. Poor House 24 by 50 feet, one and a half stories high, with two wings of 16 by 28, and 14 by 20 feet.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTICES AND REMARKS CONCERNING HOSPITALS.

[These returns were too irregular to justify any attempt at their summary, or to afford any data for general comparison. The individual facts are given as reported, with such other remarks as are embraced in the following memoranda:]

ALBANY.—Albany Hospital is under the care of a Board of Governors. The main building, on Eagle street, formerly the county jail, is of brick, 61 feet square, three stories high, with a basement. A wing, two stories high, is 41 by 61 feet. A Dispensary is connected.

BROOME.—The Inebriate Asylum was incorporated in 1854, but has only recently been put in operation. Buildings 1,453 feet in length. It receives ten per cent. of the excise money upon liquors in the State. When completed the Asylum will accommodate 500 patients.

The village Hospital, of Binghamton, is a wooden building, two stories high, 38 by 48 feet. No regularly paid attendants are employed.

CHEMUNG.—The Hospital reported is a small building occasionally used as a pest house. The patients are supported by their friends.

KINGS.—The Brooklyn City Hospital, erected in 1851, is managed by a Board. The edifice is of brick, four stories high, 52 by 200 feet, with an extension of 30 feet in the centre.

The U. S. Naval Hospital consists of two buildings, 198 by 100, and 20 by 200 feet, and is managed and supported by the general government.

The Kings County Hospital is owned and controlled by the Superintendents of the Poor of Kings County. The main building is of brick, four stories; 75 by 300 feet; engine house, 35 by 60 feet, three stories; boiler house, brick, 25 by 60 feet; small pox house, brick, three stories, 25 by 40 feet; pest house, framed, 30 by 60 feet, with several other shops and houses connected with the establishment. Paying patients are charged from \$2 to \$5 per week. The valuation of the hospital is embodied in the alms house report.

NEW YORK.—The Island Hospital building is of stone, four stories, 400 feet long. The Warden's Island Hospital consists of two buildings of stone, 60 by 350, and 30 by 100 feet respectively. Both are on Blackwell's Island, and are under the care of the Commissioners of Public Charities and Correction, as is also the Small Pox Hospital. The latter is a stone building, 50 by 180 feet in size, on the lower point of the island.

The Eye and Ear Infirmary is a three story building, 52 by 75 feet.

Many of the patients reported come there for treatment, but do not reside on the premises.

The St. Louis Hospital, is a building 50 by 280 feet, and the institution is supported chiefly by members of the Protestant Episcopal Church, although open to those of every creed. The household interests are managed by Protestant sisters of charity.

The Woman's Infirmary occupies a double house, 70 feet deep. The several dispensaries and public hospitals of New York, reporting to the legislature, forwarded their reports in connection with the census, but as these are easily accessible, they are not included in the present report.

ONEIDA.—The Utica City Hospital occupies a brick building three stories high, 70 by 100 feet.

OSWEGO.—The Marine Hospital at Oswego, is 24 by 36 feet, with an addition of 18 by 30 feet in the rear. It is owned and supported by the general government, and is classed as a contract hospital, the price per week, in 1864, having been \$4.25.

The Oswego City Hospital is controlled by the common council. Main building is of wood, 32 by 60, two stories, with a building 18 by 30 feet attached. A pest house on a corner of the grounds is 18 by 24 feet, with a kitchen 12 by 12 feet, capable of accommodating eight patients.

RENSSELAER.—The Marshal Infirmary, of Troy, is under a Board of Governors. Buildings as follows: One four stories, 45 by 100 feet; one three stories, 40 by 60 feet; and one three stories, 36 by 125 feet. It includes three departments, viz.: One for ordinary diseases, one for pestilential and contagious diseases, and one for the insane. There are also accommodations for lying-in women. The sums reported as received from the city and county, are for the poor.

RICHMOND.—The Seamen's Retreat is under state laws. Main building 60 by 300 feet. Insane Hospital 50 by 80 feet.

WESTCHESTER.—The McDougall General Hospital, is a temporary military hospital, entirely under the care and at the expense of the general government.

The several military hospitals in the state were generally omitted by the census enumerators, so far as relates to the statistics embraced in the foregoing table. A Prison for rebels captured by the army, was established at Elmira in the early part of 1864, and reported 2,858 deaths in its hospital.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTICES AND REMARKS CONCERNING ORPHAN ASYLUMS.

ALBANY.—The Juvenile Retreat of the city of Albany, occupies a three story brick building, formerly sustained by the citizens generally, but having got into pecuniary difficulty, its management was assumed by members of St Peter's (P. E.) church.

St. Vincent Male Orphan Asylum, conducted by brothers of the Christian schools, gardening, shoemaking and tailoring taught. Located about a mile and a half west of the Capitol, on the Cherry Valley road.

St. Vincent Female Orphan Asylum, conducted by Sisters of Charity, occupies a four story brick building on North Pearl street.

Albany Orphan Asylum, established Nov. 17, 1829, and incorporated under a special act in 1831. Its principal building is of brick, 100 by 50 feet, four stories high, with a brick laundry, 20 by 75 feet, and brick barn, 25 by 30 feet. A public school adjacent, supplies educational facilities.

CAYUGA.—The Cayuga County Orphan Asylum, occupies a three story building, 50 by 60 feet, with basement. The premises are restricted and ill arranged.

CHAUTAQUA.—St. Mary's Orphan Asylum, Dunkirk, has a two story building, 20 by 40 feet, with a kitchen, 10 by 20 feet attached. Needle work is taught to the inmates.

COLUMBIA.—Hudson Orphan and Relief Association. This is managed by a board of ladies, chosen from the several religious sects of the city. This building is of brick, three stories, 57 by 41 feet, and cost about \$6,000. No school except Sabbath school taught.

DUTCHESS.—Poughkeepsie Female Guardian Society, maintains a home for the friendless of all evangelical denominations. Its building is 60 by 75 feet, with three stories and a basement. Children are received from three to twelve years. It is chiefly conducted by an association of ladies.

The Astor Orphan Asylum of Redhook, occupies a building 40 feet square. It is supported by Mrs. William B. Astor, and chiefly limited to those living near Redhook.

ERIE.—The Buffalo Orphan Asylum, has one three story building, size not reported.

The St. Vincent Female Orphan Asylum is conducted by Sisters of Charity, and occupies three adjacent buildings, connected by passages. Needle work is taught with the common branches of education. The institution is reported as well kept, and in much repute.

The St. Mary's Lying-in Hospital, and St. Vincent Foundling Asylum, is managed by Sisters of Charity. Its building is 50 feet square, four stories, with three story wings, 40 by 50 feet. Since the beginning, 1,480 inmates have been received, of whom 105 remained at the close of 1864.

The Thomas Asylum, for orphan and destitute Indian children, is managed by a board of twelve trustees, of whom half are whites and half Indians, and is not sectarian. Its cost was mostly defrayed by legislative grants, and it receives appropriations from the State, and from the Indian Department of the general government. The rest is supplied by contributions. Its main building is 46 by 36 feet, two stories and a basement, with another 36 by 40, one and a half stories, connected with it. The basements are stone and brick, but the rest are of wood. A shop, 26 by 66 feet, with lean-to, 12 by 12; a small barn, 26 by 30 feet, with lean-to, 10 by 30 feet; a large barn 30 by 50 feet, and a school house 30 by 40 feet, constitute the other principal buildings of the establishment. The schools were suspended several weeks during the summer of 1864, on account of sickness. An accompanying list of inmates shows that 42 were Senecas, 7 Cayugas, 2 Onondagas, and 1 Oneida. A summary of ages, shows the following ages and sexes: four years, 1 male; five, 2 males; six, 3 males, 3 females; seven, 1 male, 2 females; eight, 1 male, 5 females; nine, 3 males, 3 females; ten, 3 males, 2 females; eleven, 5 males, 1 female; twelve, 3 females; thirteen, 4 males, 1 female; fourteen, 1 male; fifteen, 2 males; sixteen, 1 male, 1 female; seventeen, 1 female; eighteen, 1 female; nineteen, 1 female; twenty, 1 female.

JEFFERSON.—The Jefferson County Orphan Asylum has a brick building 52 by 68 feet, three stories with an attic, and ample grounds, in a grove adjacent to Watertown village. About \$1,500 in clothing and provisions had been donated by citizens during the year, in addition to the amount given in the table.

KINGS.—The Brooklyn Orphan Asylum is not controlled by any particular sect. Its building is 50 by 75 feet, three stories high.

The Brooklyn Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum, founded in 1829, was incorporated in 1834. The premises occupied by the males consist of two brick buildings, one three and the other four stories, located corner of Jay and Chapel streets. The female department occupies three buildings, four stories high. Both are under the care of the same trustees.

The Home for Destitute Children is managed by the Brooklyn Industrial School Association. The building is 50 by 100 feet, four stories and basement. The Association paid, on account of schools, during the year, \$3,001.82; of the Home, \$11,491.82. Received from collections in churches, \$6,160; from board of children, \$2,322.05; from festival, \$3,439.50. Total receipts, including bequests, \$23,183.

MONROE.—St. Patrick's Female Orphan Asylum, at Rochester, founded in 1840, was incorporated in 1845. It occupies a large four story brick building, with a wing, and is managed by Sisters of Charity. Free and select schools are attached to the institution. Number of pupils 260. No reports were received from other asylums in Rochester.

NEW YORK.—Children's Aid Society. During the previous year 738 boys, 416 girls, 35 men and 46 women had been provided with houses. The Society provides lodging rooms and meals for destitute children of both sexes, and maintains twelve industrial schools in poor and squalid quarters of the city.

Five Points House of Industry. Established in 1851. Owns two brick buildings of 45 by 92, and 60 by 80 feet. Real estate worth \$100,000.

The House of Protection for Destitute Catholic Boys is under the direction of a society, and reports three brick and five frame buildings, on a lot of four acres.

The New York Orphan Asylum is managed by a board of ladies, and occupies a building 50 by 145 feet, with wings 36 by 72 feet. It is chiefly supported by annual subscriptions.

The Nursery and Childs' Hospital is managed by a board of lady trustees. From the published report it appears that, from the year ending March 1, 1865, 501 children had been under care. The Asylum had suffered from epidemic measles, complicated with diphtheria, and five deaths had occurred. Their receipts were: Income, \$5,941.39; subscriptions, \$1,915.00; donations, \$5,091.24; bequest, \$5,000; sale of stocks, \$7,000; interest on bonds, \$793; concert, \$3,240, other sources, \$250.60. Expenses, \$29,392.17.

Orphan Home and Asylum of the Protestant Episcopal Church; founded in 1850; incorporated 1852 and 1857. Its edifice is a stone faced brick building 60 by 125 feet. Its schools are in operation throughout the year.

The Patriot Orphan Home is under the care of the New York Ladies' Educational Union, and occupies a three story dwelling, 45 by 52, with a wing 37½ by 53 feet.

The New York Colored Orphan Asylum is managed by the Association for the Benefit of Colored Orphans; formed in 1836, and incorporated in 1838. Its premises having been destroyed by a mob in 1863, it occupied rented buildings. A claim of \$73,000, for property destroyed, had been received, and preparations made for the erection of new buildings. Admitted since the opening, 1,310. Number at last report, 208. Admitted during the year, 53. Number at date of published report of 1864, 121 boys and 88 girls. Three schools were maintained. Expenses, \$19,614.99.

The Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum was established in 1817, and incorporated with the Half Orphan Asylum in 1852. Its main building, on Fifth avenue is 60 by 160 feet, with wings 40 by 104 feet. In addition to this, the society owns a building on Prince street, concerning which no report was received.

ONEIDA.—The Utica Orphan Asylum, was established April 19, 1830, and the act was revived March 26, 1856. Main building, 46 by 130 feet, with wings, 28 by 100 and 28 by 88 feet. Half orphans and others having friends able to aid, are charged from 50 cents to \$1.00 per week. Those on county charge, pay \$1.15 per week.

ONTARIO.—The Ontario Orphan Asylum, is managed by a board of Protestant trustees and managers, and occupies a building erected for a dwelling, with 16 rooms, with basement, dining room, etc. The accounts kept for the year ending May 2, 1864, were as follows: Receipts from Canandaigua subscribers, \$1,208.76; fairs and festivals, \$809.85; other sources, \$1,681.10. Receipts for the year ending May, 1865, \$4,423.88, not including donations of provisions etc., from Canandaigua and neighboring towns.

OSWEGO.—The Oswego Orphan Asylum, occupies a building 50 feet square. Paying orphans are charged \$1.00 per week.

RENSSELAER.—The Catholic Male Orphan Asylum of Troy, occupies a brick building three stories high, with a wooden attic, 36 by 62 feet.

The St. Vincent Female Asylum has a building 25 by 130 feet, and two of 22 by 100 feet, each three stories high and of brick.

RICHMOND.—The Home for seamen's children, is managed by a board of lady managers, entitled "The Society for the Relief of Destitute Children of Seamen," and chiefly resident in New York city. The published report of 1864, shows during the year ending June, 1864, a total expenditure of \$6,496.94, aside from investments.

STEBEN.—The Davenport Institution for Female Orphan children, was incorporated by special act April 15, 1863, and occupies a building 44 by 66 feet. It receives by preference, orphans from Steuben, and after this, from Allegany county.
